We would like to thank all of the many members who contributed to the work of the Network this year. In particular, we would like to thank the officers Maureen Jackson, Treasurer, and Mags Arnold who took over from Teresa Ahearne as Secretary. A special thank you to staff members Gráinne Furey and Deirdre Lane who worked hard over the past year organising events, coordinating projects and providing support to members. We currently have 25 member organisations and 22 individual members.

Members take on many roles, from speaking at events; keeping the Network's administration organised and efficient; sitting on Steering Committees for larger projects, e.g. our Creative Ireland Climate Action 'Pathways' project; attending regional or national events and hosting members at their own organisation's events, e.g. Knockanore Biodiversity Group's guided walk.

We also thank Cumann na Daoine, our host organisation, which has provided support to the Youghal Blue & Green Network from the very beginning. Cumann na Daoine provides direct administrative support (managing accounts and payroll), dedicated office space and access to training rooms and all other facilities in the building, including the Community Café. We, in turn, work with other community workers in the building - ETB, Traveller Project, Local Community Development and Ukraine Resource Centre, linking them into Blue & Green projects and actions and encouraging participation from these groups.

We also offer direct support to community members of the Network, e.g. Clean Coasts, Community Bus, CRY104fm Community Radio, Youghal Community Health Project, Youghal Family Resource Initiative, Youghal Credit Union and all local schools, as well as individual members wishing to work collaboratively with us on projects, e.g. artists and environmentalists.

We look forward to working with you all in the coming year!

Key Community Projects

* Community Engagement

We organised over **560 events** during 2023, which included workshops, walkshops, forages, surveys, film evenings, presentations and meetings. Over **3,400 participants** engaged across all events.

We also raised awareness of Youghal Blue & Green Community Network by attending and participating in a Speakers Panel at the *Mary Robinson Climate Conference* in Ballina, and in November we hosted a stand, gave a presentation and acted as moderator at the Department of Rural and Community Development conference *Community Climate Action* in Dublin Castle.

Four workshops were offered to members throughout the year:

- (1) Climate Advocacy, delivered online by Uplift in December, focusing on improving climate literacy and taking community climate action.
- (2) A workshop delivered by MaREI UCC in October focused on monitoring and recording impact.
- (3) 'Matterport' IT training with Tom.
- (4) In collaboration with Dingle Hub, we shared information and experiences of climate action, visited the Maharees Sand Dune Restoration Project and visited 'My Gug' mini-digestor near Clonakilty.

* Community Garden

The Community Garden is now in its second year with approximately 64 Garden Group members working away on a regular basis. Harvests this year included tomatoes, garlic, cabbage, and there were even a few Tasting Days where members prepared food from the garden to share onsite. Our two Community Employment (TÚS and CE) caretakers Philly and Rusty did fantastic work building beds and shelving, planting and creating a new pathway to the tunnel to ensure the gardens are wheelchair accessible. Philly posts opening hours each week into the Garden WhatsApp group so volunteers can plan when to drop in. Philly began training on a horticulture course and it is wonderful to see his skills grow as he becomes a key asset to the garden and its members. Volunteers help with planting. watering, weeding and harvesting. Every few weeks, the Network offers workshops on horticulture, making beds, willow weaving and composting. Niamh Doyle completed her work experience as part of her Permaculture course and, with the help of members Eva, Ally and Robin, created a 'Grow Plan' as well as a three-year plan for the garden. these in a beautiful book form and both are available to view onsite.

The Community Garden is open every week to the public. New members are very welcome, as are collaborations for projects such as with Youghal Men's Shed, who created bird boxes that were designed with expert advice from Birdwatch Ireland and ETB Gardening and Sustainability tutor Olivia Nolan.

Olivia gave an informative talk, and another talk on garden birds was given by Jim Wilson from Birdwatch Ireland's Cork branch. Garden regular Kevin Walshe, who also represents Youghal Active Retirement Association (YARA) on the Blue & Green Network, designed and created a stained glass installation with his class led by ETB art tutor Sue, this beautiful piece of art is admired by all onsite. We explored our willow craft heritage by using willow for weaving, fence-making, dying, rope-making and charcoal, as well as its importance for pollinators. With funds from Burrenbeo Trust, a Heritage Keepers group was formed with Jacob, April, Lizet and Theresa who completed online and in-person workshops to understand the historical importance of willow and how using old crafts is a sustainable alternative in the garden. Pat Deasy, Irish Bee Conservation Project, has given us several talks about the native Solitary Bee. Pat erected educational signage onsite as well as a bee hotel which we are monitoring.

* Energy Info Hub

The Energy Info Hub is located in Cumann na Daoine Community Café and is staffed every Thursday from 11am to 1pm.

Staff offer support, assistance and advice in reviewing the services, grants and options available for retrofitting homes, businesses and community organisations. This support includes energy audits, changing your heating or lighting system, seeking grants and inserting greater levels of insulation into your home or business.

* National Bike Week

Youghal Blue & Green Community Network secured funding from Cork Sports Partnership for Bike Week from 15-21 May 2023.

Network members got to try out both E-bikes and regular bikes from Youghal Bike Hire who also visited Gaelscoil Choráin to talk about bike maintenance and safety.

* Circular Economy (CE)

Events commenced/hosted in 2023:

- Hosted a workshop on Circular Economy Christmas Fashion
- Received funding to develop a Community Circular Economy Action Plan with VOICE Ireland, inc. development of a local Directory in 2024
- Nappy Library Group meeting regularly
- Circular BioEconomy Regional Seeds & Fibre Youghal being explored
- Care and Repair scheme for Youghal established with SECAD
- Men's Shed Library of Things beginning to grow, e.g. tools, materials, small equipment

* Community Radio

This year we learned new skills to co-create 3 programmes with CRY104fm Community Radio Youghal, focused on environmental topics that are relevant to the citizens of Youghal. These included programmes about the Network itself, members' own projects, the Keane Park Pond and Clean Coasts beach cleans.

In partnership with CRY104fm, we aim to increase the number of regular Blue & Green programmes in 2024 through dedicating worker time to coordinating and delivering a monthly programme. Participation from member groups and individuals on radio shows is welcome and a great way to get information out to the community, while hopefully gaining interest & support. CRY104fm has been very proactive in supporting the Network throughout 2023.

* Tree Planting

The wonderful volunteers at *Trees Please* donated native trees and hedging to us that they had grown locally from seed. We had an excellent Planting Practice workshop with the esteemed botanist and ecologist Ted Cook. As well as hedging, we planted Hazel, Birch, Scots Pine and two Yew trees; these are symbolic as Youghal is named after the Yew.

A longer-term 'Greening' project has been agreed with Cumann na Daoine to transition the use of energy in the building and food waste practices to being more energy efficient & having more sustainable practices.

* Community Bus



In 2023, with the cooperation of the Community Bus Committee, the Network successfully applied to the Cork County Council Recognition Fund for a new Electric Vehicle (EV) bus (€50,000 awarded).

We also successfully applied to Eirgrid with the Community Bus Committee for funding for an EV wheelchair-accessible car to complement the existing bus (€70,000 awarded). These buses are now serving the people of Youghal, and the Community Bus has increased its availability each week.

We wish the Community Bus group and the residents of Youghal much greener travel for the years ahead.

* Youghal Climate Action Week



2023 was the first year we hosted a Climate Action Week in Youghal and it was delivered with great input from many Network members.

Activities included tree planting, beach cleans, workshops with Spring Chickens Older People's Club, a cinema evening, bee conservation, digital decluttering and harvest sampling (in conjunction with the first ever National Community Garden Week) at our Community Garden Open Day, .

We also hosted creative writers at Youghal Library, additional Blue & Green radio programmes and a coastal survey/exploration.

It was a hugely successful week and enthusiasm is building for our 2024 event already.

Creative Climate Action

There were two key initiatives in 2023:

(I) Showcasing Blue & Green creative climate action at the annual *Earth Rising* festival at the Irish Museum of Modern Art (IMMA). This included the screening of *Coillte*, a short film by Irene Tanner; poetry, music and movement by Fergal O' Connor and Lani O'Hanlon and ceramic 'Swift Making' workshops by Martha Cashman, along with a panel discussion hosted by Blue & Green worker Deirdre Lane, with panellists Maria Power, Irene Tanner and Bernie Connolly.

(II) Following our successful application to the Creative Ireland Climate Action Fund, our project *Pathways: Creating Community Resilience* began in 2023, focusing on rising sea levels and flooding in Youghal.

This arts-based project will run until November 2024 and activities include walkshops, public meetings and collaboration between local residents and artists on art and audio installations.

The key focus is public engagement in understanding the threat of climate change, and developing community approaches and resilience to mitigate and respond appropriately to the threats inherent in rising sea levels and flooding.

* Citizen Science

Our main focus this year has been on water monitoring in the River Tourig, which was led by our member Maureen with the support of Local Authority Waters Programme LAWPRO.

The Blue & Green Network has its own water monitoring equipment which can be borrowed by any member who wishes to carry out a water review.

* Working with Schools

We are delighted to say we are now working with the four schools located in Youghal. These are Gaelscoil Choráin, Bun Scoil, South Abbey National School and Pobalscoil na Tríonóide secondary school. Projects include beach surveys, visits to the Community Garden and hosting Transition Year (TY) students on placement.





* Funding

* Staff

There are 2.5 dedicated staff in the Blue & Green Community Network: Gráinne Furey (focus on Blue & Green matters) and Deirdre Lane (focus on Youghal's energy transition to a low carbon community). Dr Maria Power supervises the project on behalf of Cumann na Daoine and the Network. Both staff have worked with commitment, supporting members with funding applications, organising events, workshops and presentations along with promoting the Network to the wider public.

* Governance

Blue & Green Network staff report to the Network Coordinator, provide quarterly reports to funders and to the Cumann na Daoine Board of Management. Cumann na Daoine is a Company Limited by Guarantee, a registered charity and the employer of Blue & Green Network staff.



* Monitoring and Evaluation


Youghal Blue & Green Network worked in partnership with MaREI UCC to develop a formal evaluation framework and impact pathways to capture the successes and challenges of community-led climate action. This is a three-year project but some of the results are as follows:

Network Survey


Youghal Blue & Green Community Network carried out an Impact Survey with all members and interviewed group members between October and November 2023.

The results are available separately but here are 2 key pieces of information: In 1-to-1 interviews, all members (those representing groups only) expressed the value of Blue & Green work for Youghal, and the majority agreed that the key challenges are communication as a two-way process and giving time to the Network.

* Other Actions

Youghal Blue & Green Community Network is always keen to link our local heritage with biodiversity. In 2023, we hosted several guided tours on that theme.

Water Heritage Day 2023

The Network hosted a trip up the Blackwater River for Network members on Tony Gallagher's boat *The Meavóg*. Tony spoke of the history and lore of life for those on the river and its related fishing and other trades. On the same trip, ornithologist Pat Smiddy talked to us about the range of birdlife along the Blackwater. This event was funded by the Local Authorities Water Programme (LAWPRO).

Heritage Keepers

As part of the Network's participation in the Heritage Keepers programme, the Burrenbeo Trust funded several guided tours. Tour Guide Shirley gave our group a most fascinating insight to Youghal's famous landmark the Clockgate Tower. Tour Guide Clifford brought us back in time as we took the walking tour of the town and St Mary's Collegiate church.

These tours are also a great way for members and non-members to meet and share ideas as we usually have refreshments after.
